The Parks Canada Palisades Stewardship Education Centre in Jasper National Park engages and inspires our youth, the future ambassadors and guardians of Canada's National Parks, Historic Sites and Marine Conservation Areas.

#### Winter Travel Courses

The Palisades Centre delivered eleven Winter Travel courses, including the first course delivered in French (to a group of Franco-Albertan schools) and the first 35-level (grade 12) course. This high school program allows students to obtain 3 credits while experiencing different ways to safely travel through the winter landscape. Students taking this residential program go skiing and riding at Marmot Basin, cross-country ski, snowshoe and learn survival basics. They also get familiar with avalanche risks and those at the grade 11 level get their Avalanche Skills Training Level 1 certification.



#### **Robert Bateman Unconference**

The second annual Robert Bateman Get to Know International Unconference took place on October 20-23 in Jasper. About 100 delegates including twenty-nine dedicated youth, ages 13 to 22, gathered together for 3 days of participant-driven forums and engagement. The Unconference attracted some well known champions of getting kids back in touch with nature. The youth spent the day at the Palisades



Centre for leadership training as Get to Know Youth Ambassadors. This included time spent capturing mountain vistas in water colour, photography and sketches. Special guests included Les Stroud – star of the hit TV series Survivorman, who led a rafting trip on the Athabasca River and Adam Kreek, Olympic Gold Medalist and motivational speaker, who took the delegates canoeing on Lac Beauvert.


